

Go for a walk and take a photo of each object to share on SeeSaw. Describe what you see, feel and smell. Think about the objects, the materials they are made of and their observable properties. Go back to your picture map and tick the things that you saw on your walk. In another colour, add any other things that you saw.	Go for a bushwalk with your family and collect some materials like gumnuts, leaves, bark and sticks, then use these materials to make a poster of a kangaroo's habitat. Using pencils or texta's, draw a kangaroo, cut it out and glue onto its habitat poster. Here is an example.
