ANZAC COMMEMORATIONS

Thank you to The Entrance - Long Jetty RSL Sub-Branch for their generous donation of \$100 to our school library for the purchase of Anzac resources to support our students with their learning.

We will be holding our Anzac Day Memorial Assembly at school on Friday 8 April commencing at 10.30 am. Families are most welcome.

POPPY PROJECT

Last year, to mark ANZAC Day, Gosford Council and local historian, Merrill Jackson, organised the making and displaying of hand-made poppies near Gosford City's waterfront. The Poppy Project: Never Forgetting the Sacrifices – Gosford 2015 sparked widespread local, national and international recognition, with public admiration for the spectacular sea of handmade red poppies created by the Central Coast community.

Due to the popularity and success of this event, they will follow up this year with the Poppy Project: Never Forgetting the Sacrifices – Terrigal 2016. Schools in the Gosford and Wyong networks have been invited to make poppies for the Terrigal Skillion display, to be installed in time for ANZAC Day 2016. This year marks 100 years since our Australian First World War personnel disembarked along a distant coastline to join the Western Front campaign. Our school will be a part of the poppy making project this year with students from our kindergarten to our Year 6 classes creating poppies to go on display at Terrigal. If you are near Terrigal around ANZAC Day please visit the display. I guarantee it will be an amazing sight and an emotional experience.

FIXED EQUIPMENT

As I write this, the final installation of our new fixed equipment is taking place. Once the equipment is 'handed over' to the school, we will take each class out for an orientation on the new play stations as they are very different to the old. Please be aware that these stations are not to be used before or after school, as direct supervision is required, for the safety of the students.

LEARNING AND MANAGEMENT BUSINESS REFORMS (LMBR)

As mentioned in our last newsletter, all Department of Education Central Coast Primary schools are beginning the systemic process of moving all learning and business tools into one state-wide system. Central Coast primary schools are the first region in the implementation process. This will have some impact on the community regarding payments and some school processes which will be communicated as the need arises.

Before the new system "goes live" on 16 May, there will be a 'financial freeze' from **Monday 9 May until Friday 20 May**. During this period the school **WILL NOT** be able to accept any money.

For families with students attending the Athletics Carnival please take note of the final payment date, as this will be effected by the 'freeze'.

ROAD SAFETY

Unfortunately this year there has been two separate occasions on the Central Coast where students have been injured by a car after alighting from their bus on the way home. Both students walked in front of the bus and into the path of an oncoming vehicle. Thankfully neither student was seriously injured; however the situation could have been much worse.

The road safety message for all students is: Wait until the bus has gone and then use a safe place to cross the road. As we head towards another holiday break it is timely to refresh our students' awareness of road safety. Key messages are: hold an adult's hand and use a safe place to cross the road.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECKS (WWCC)

A new WWCC system was introduced through legislation in 2013 requiring people in child related work to have a WWCC clearance. A transition period of up to five years was established to allow different sections of the community to phase-in to the new WWCC system. All employees in the educational field must have a WWCC. Currently any volunteers working with children in Department of Education schools must at a minimum have a Working with children Check – Declaration for volunteers and contractors. This is a declaration form completed by volunteers, with proof of identity. These forms can be collected at our front office.

In 2017 ALL people working with children – regardless of being an employee or volunteer will have to have completed the WWCC and receive a specific approval number before they will be able to work, in any capacity with children. Volunteers DO NOT have to pay the \$80 registration fee. Forms can be completed via our website link and taken to any Department of Services NSW for processing. This can be done now instead of waiting until 2017.

Our school relies heavily on our fabulous team of volunteers to ensure we can offer many extra-curricula activities to our students. Please help us by completing the WWCC so you can continue to volunteer at our school.

NAPLAN Testing – The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be completed by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 in May 2016. The results of these tests will provide important information to schools about what each child can do, and what will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement. Each student's level of achievement will be reported against the national minimum standard. The NAPLAN tests will be conducted from May 10-12 (Term 2 Week 3) 2016. The program of testing is as follows:

Tuesday May 10 – Language Conventions (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar) / Writing

Wednesday May 11 – Reading

Thursday May 12 – Numeracy

Friday May 13 – Catch up tests for any student who is absent.

Please note that students may be considered for exemption from the tests if they: are newly arrived in Australia (less than one year before the test) and with a language background other than English OR have significant intellectual disability and / or significant co-existing conditions which severely limit their capacity to participate in the tests. ALL OTHER STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE TESTS. Disability adjustments which reflect the student's normal level of support in the classroom may be provided. Students may be withdrawn from NAPLAN by their parent or carer. This is a matter for consideration by parents in

consultation with the school Principal. If you wish to withdraw your child from the tests, a parent or carer consent form must be signed. Please make an appointment with the Principal or Deputy Principal if you would like to discuss your child's participation in NAPLAN

Seasons for Growth – Change and loss are issues that affect all of us at some stage of our lives. At Bateau Bay P.S. we recognise that when changes occur in families through death, separation, divorce or related circumstances, young people may benefit from learning how to manage these changes effectively. We are therefore offering a very successful education program called Seasons for Growth during Terms 2 and 3. This program is facilitated in small groups and is based on research that highlights the importance of social support and the need to practise new skills to cope effectively with change and loss. The program focuses on issues such as self-esteem, managing feelings, problem-solving, decision making, effective communication and support networks. "Seasons for Growth" runs for 8 weeks and each weekly session is 40-45 minutes. The program concludes with a "celebration" session. If you think your son / daughter would benefit from "Seasons for Growth" we would encourage you to talk to him / her first about this. Should he / she decide to participate please ask for an information letter via your class teacher or contact the school on 4332 8000. If you require further information about this program please contact Mr Waite.

Student Representative Council (SRC) news: On Tuesday we held our third SRC meeting of the year. The SRC discussed three areas: the Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) Mascot, the Semester 1 disco and the Term 1 reward. The SRC members conducted class surveys for the PBL mascot – a choice of a whale, bottle nosed dolphin or seahorse. After conducting class surveys the bottle-nosed dolphin was chosen as the PBL mascot. Mr Jennings will be announcing the news at Friday's assembly.
