- Hand it in with your School Banking Deposit on School Banking Day.

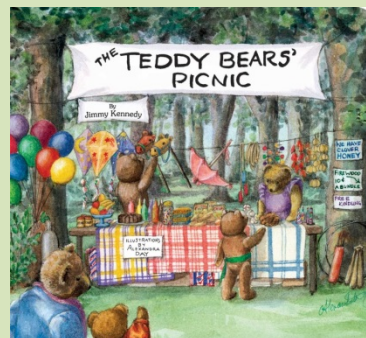

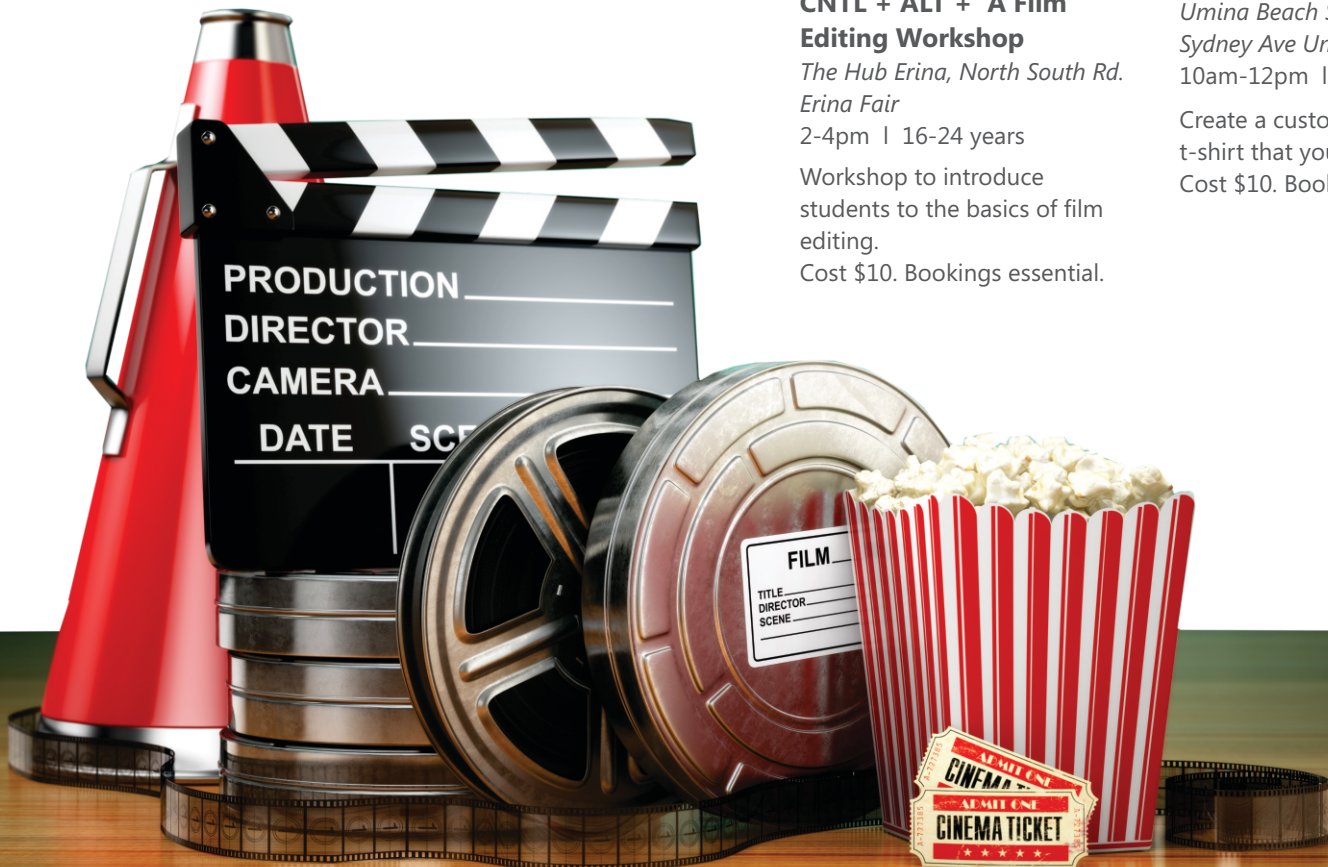
