STUDENT ENROLMENTS AT BBPS

In this newsletter we have again attached a sheet of Frequently Asked Questions regarding student enrolments at BBPS. Any student who resides within the Bateau Bay Public School catchment (enrolment) area is eligible to be enrolled at our school. The school office can provide families with confirmation regarding their address and our catchment area.

Any family not residing in our catchment area, is required to complete an Out of Zone (OOZ) Application to apply for enrolment – this includes families who currently have siblings at the school.

This year, the OOZ committee, comprising of the Principal, a representative from the P&C and a staff representative, will meet to consider all OOZ applications in Term 3. The first meeting will be held on **Tuesday 7 August** with another meeting being to be held on **Thursday 6 September 2018**. Any OOZ applications wishing to be considered, will need to be submitted to the school prior to these dates.

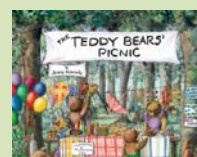

NATIONAL SWIMMING CHAMPIONSHIPS 2018

It has been a huge week of competition for our star swimmer, Brock H (Year 6). He has been in Hobart, Tasmania representing NSW at the National Swimming Championships where he competed in the 12-Year-Old Boys 200m freestyle, 100m freestyle and NSW relay team events. On Thursday 26 July 2018, Brock competed in the 200m freestyle event where he placed fourth in Australia. The following Monday, he swam in the 100m freestyle heats, to be the 3rd fastest qualifier in the final event to be held that evening. In a nail biting close race, Brock placed an impressive fifth in Australia. The next day, Tuesday 31 July 2018, Brock competed as part of the 12-Year-Old Boys NSW relay team, who came third and received a bronze medal on the day!

YOU CAN SURVIVE A RIP CURRENT BY KNOWING YOUR OPTIONS



-  AVOID RIP CURRENTS, ALWAYS SWIM BETWEEN THE RED AND YELLOW FLAGS
-  FOR ASSISTANCE, STAY CALM, FLOAT AND RAISE AN ARM TO ATTRACT ATTENTION
-  TO ESCAPE A RIP CURRENT, SWIM PARALLEL TO THE BEACH
-  CONSERVE YOUR ENERGY, WAVES CAN ASSIST YOU BACK TO THE BEACH

- You can survive a rip current by knowing your options.
- To avoid rips, always swim between the red and yellow flags. Reinforce this!
- For assistance; stay calm, float, raise an arm and attract attention. Lifesavers, Lifeguards or Surfers may be able to assist.
- To escape a rip, swim parallel to the beach.
- Swim slowly to conserve your energy, and swim towards the breaking waves.
- The breaking waves are in shallower water and you may be able to walk back to the beach, or use the waves to help push you back to the shore.



Don't swim directly after a meal.
Don't swim under the influence of alcohol or drugs

Never run or dive in the water, even if you have checked before.
Water conditions can change.

Tell Them From Me parent survey

Dear Parents/Caregivers

This Term, our school will be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, ipads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted between 27 August and 26 October. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

What is PBL?

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is an evidence-based whole school systems approach which addresses the diverse academic and social needs of every student. PBL is team driven and engages all students, parents and staff in establishing positive social expectations for all in the school community as well as collectively supporting the wellbeing of every student.

The PBL expectations at Bateau Bay Public School are:

Safe	Respectful	Responsible
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It is expected that these values are upheld by everybody, everywhere, every time!

Marley's

Every day, the students of Bateau Bay Public School have the opportunity to earn Marley's in the playground and classroom. Students are recognised for following the PBL expectations and acknowledged with a Marley Merit. These Marley's are collected by students and used to buy into various activities held at the end of each term during the PBL Reward Day celebrations.

Students have the option to buy in to as many or as few activities as they wish. Students have the opportunity to save their Marley's to buy in to major reward activities e.g. Movies. If students choose not to participate in Reward Day activities, they will continue with class based work.



Activities offered to each stage are determined by the suggestions of students and SRC members. The students of each stage then have the opportunity to vote for their stage activities.

The value of each activity is determined by each stage through consultation with the SRC and teachers and, is explained to the students prior to buy in day via PBL Rewards Day Menus.

ENROLMENT FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Does BBPS have an enrolment policy?

Our school's enrolment policy provides detailed information for parents intending to enrol their child at Bateau Bay Public School. The policy is consistent with Department of Education Enrolment Policies and Procedures.

When should my child commence school?

Preparedness for school varies from child to child. You are encouraged to discuss any concerns with current childcare providers or make an appointment with school staff (via school office). Students are able to commence from as young as 4 years of age, providing they turn 5 on or before the 31st July of the commencement year. Compulsory school attendance for all students commences at 6 years of age.

I reside within the local school catchment area. Will there be a place for my child at BBPS?

While-ever you reside within the Bateau Bay Public School catchment area, you are eligible to enrol your children at BBPS. Our school office can provide confirmation that your address is within the school catchment area.

I do not reside within the Bateau Bay Public School catchment area. Am I able to enrol my child?

Applications for non-local placement may be lodged and will be assessed by a panel comprising both school and community representatives, dependant on the numbers of local enrolments.

I currently have a child attending Bateau Bay PS. I have since moved outside of the local school catchment zone. Is it possible for my other children to be enrolled at BBPS?

Families who relocate outside of the BBPS catchment area will be eligible to enrol future children at their new local school. Non-local applications for siblings can be made, and will be assessed consistent with school enrolment policy. *Parents wishing to ensure all children attend the same primary school have the option to enrol all their children at their new local school.*

My child does not currently have a placement or has been placed upon a waiting list for enrolment at Bateau Bay Public School. Are they able to participate in the 'NewBees' orientation program?

Only students with a confirmed placement at Bateau Bay Public School for the following year are eligible to participate in the 'NewBees' orientation program. Parents of all other children are encouraged to contact and participate in any enrolment programs at their locally designated school to assist with their transition to school.

When Can I enrol my child?

Enrolments for the following year can be made from the beginning of the current calendar year. Families are encouraged to enrol early to enable us to communicate relevant information to you throughout the year prior to enrolment. Early enrolment assists the school to ascertain student numbers and plan staffing and resourcing. Successful enrolment made prior to the end of Term 3 of the preceding years will be included in the NewBees Orientation Program which occurs in October each year.
