SEL Social & Emotional Learning

STUDENT WELLBEING – PARENT & CARER INFORMATION

Students and teachers have enjoyed our first SEL lesson. We have been busy learning about the four Zones and understanding how we can categorise emotions, which has allowed us to develop an increasing awareness of our own emotions and state of alertness. Next week students gain further understandings through lesson 2. You will find details of this lesson and how you can help below.

LESSON 2:

IDENTIFYING EMOTIONS IN SELF AND OTHERS

In this lesson, students are provided with opportunities to expand their vocabulary of emotional terms whilst deepening their understandings of the Zones. They delve further into recognition of facial expressions and learn to identify the Zones in themselves and others. Students grasp the social nature of feelings, emotions and behaviour and learn that our Zone can affect the respective Zone of someone else.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

- ✓ Use the language and talk about the Zones as they apply to you at home, school and other environments.
- ✓ Make comments aloud so your child understands it is natural to experience all the Zones.
- ✓ Model how you feel - what Zone you are in and what you will do to self-regulate.
- ✓ Help your child gain an awareness of how his or her Zone and feelings can affect your Zone ie, "I can feel myself in the yellow Zone when you do not do as I have asked".
- ✓ Encourage your child to share his or her Zone with you each morning and afternoon or use a check-in system to become comfortable using the language to communicate feelings and needs.
- ✓ Refer to the Zones handout – perhaps it's on your fridge or somewhere at home which is handy to refer to as a 'check in' system. You might like to create your own family check in system (type 'Zones of Regulation' in Google or browse Pinterest 'Zones of Regulation Check-in' for some extra ideas).

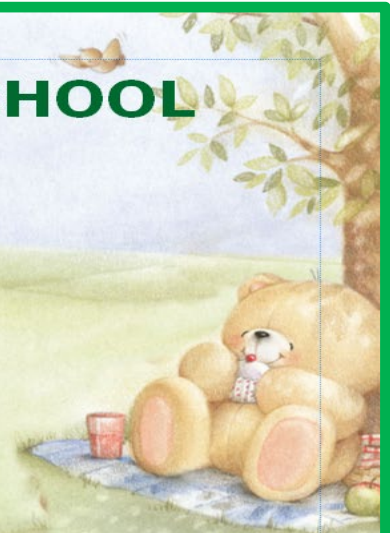

SCHOOL RADIO 'JINGLE' COMPETITION



Bateau Bay Public school is planning to create and run a small 'radio station' that will broadcast content to the school COLA area from 8.30am to 8.47am once or twice per week starting in the middle of Term 3.

The school is holding a radio 'jingle' competition open to all students and classes at the school. A committee will decide on the winning entry which will become the 'BBPS radio school jingle'. It will be played at the start of each radio broadcast to open the show.

Entries can be submitted from Friday 5 July. The competition closes at 4.00pm on Friday 26 July. Sound files should be e-mailed to bbpsradiojinglecompetition@gmail.com.

The 'jingle' should be no more than 10 seconds long and can contain voice, music, and / or sound effects. Flash drives labelled with a student's name and class will be accepted. The preferred sound file format is WAV.

There are many examples of radio jingles online to listen to for ideas. A montage of ideas can be viewed at <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=G2kbPZusCqw&feature=youtu.be>.

Many free applications are available to make a jingle ranging from the basic sound recorder on Windows PCs or Sound Memos on Apple devices. More complex productions could be made using apps like Garage band, Adobe Audition or Audacity <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=VKTv-Sb9SoQ>.

All competition entries should be created by students or classes with minimal support from adults. Students may be asked to talk about their entry to explain how they made their jingle. The school would much rather have a jingle that contains sound effects made with spoons and forks from the kitchen draw and children singing than a finely tuned audio production that has been made with limited input from the students.

IMPORTANT POINTS TO REMEMBER

Kids need to be at school every day.

If your child is sick you need to; phone the school, use the Skoolbag app or send in a note when your child returns to school, to notify the school within 7 days of the first day of absence. For absences of 2 or more days, it is a good idea to provide a Dr's certificate.

Sometimes there are family issues; you will need to let the school know your child will be away.

Let the school know if you intend to take a holiday during the school term.

Celebrate that your child is meeting new friends and growing up.

Ask them "What was the best part of the day" or "What did you like the most".

Help your child get organised the night before, pack bags, get uniform ready – this can help avoid the "morning rush".

If there are any concerns speak to your child's teacher or a staff member at the school.

Student Enrolment K-6 FAQ

Does my local school have an enrolment policy?

Each school has an enrolment policy which provides information for parents intending to enrol their children. All policies are consistent with Department of Education Enrolment Policies and Procedures.

When can my child commence school?

Preparedness for school varies from child to child. You are encouraged to discuss any concerns with current childcare providers or make an appointment to meet with school staff. Students are able to commence from as young as 4 years of age, providing they turn 5 on or before the 31st July of the commencement year. Compulsory school attendance for all students commences at 6 years of age.

I reside within the local school catchment area. Will there be a place for my child at Bateau Bay Public School?

While you reside within the local catchment area, you are eligible to enrol your child at the school. Our office can provide confirmation that your address is within the school catchment area.

I do not reside within the BBPS local catchment area. Am I able to enrol my child?

Applications for non-local placement may be lodged and will be assessed by a panel comprising both school and community representatives consistent with school policy. Non-local places are limited by the number of vacancies made possible in permanent classroom facilities.

I currently have a child attending BBPS. I have since moved outside of the local school catchment zone. Is it possible for my other children to now be enrolled at BBPS?

Families who relocate outside of the local catchment area will be eligible to enrol future children at their **new** local school. Non-local applications for siblings can be made, and will be assessed consistent with school enrolment policy. *Parents wishing to ensure all children attend the same primary school have the option to enrol all their children at their new local school.*

My child does not currently have a placement or has been placed upon a waiting list for enrolment at Bateau Bay Public School. Are they able to participate in the school's Orientation Program?

Students with a confirmed placement at Bateau Bay Public School for the following year are eligible to participate in school's Orientation Program. Parents of all other children are encouraged to participate in any enrolment programs offered at their local designated school to assist with their transition to school.

When can I enrol my child?


Enrolments for the following year can be made from the beginning of the current calendar year. Families are encouraged to enrol early to enable the school to communicate relevant information to you throughout the year prior to enrolment. Early enrolment also assists the school to ascertain student numbers and plan staffing and resourcing. Successful enrolment made prior to the end of Term 3 of the preceding year will enable your child to be included in any Orientation Programs, usually held during Term 4.
