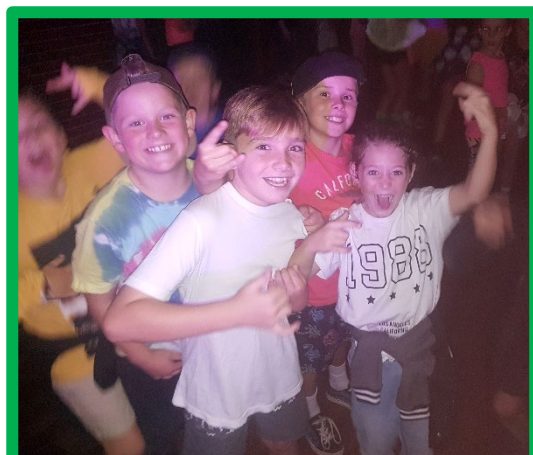

CHANGES FOR TERM 3

REVISED ENROLMENT POLICY

As of Term 3 2019 the New South Wales Department of Education will revise their Enrolment Policy in regards to out of zone applications. Each school will have a student cap placed on it.

Bateau Bay Public School has already reached capacity based on this cap.

This policy relates to all new enrolments at BBPS including those of siblings. The Department of Education expects all families to contact their designated local school to begin enrolment procedures.

Out of Zone applications may still be lodged and departmental guidelines will be followed.

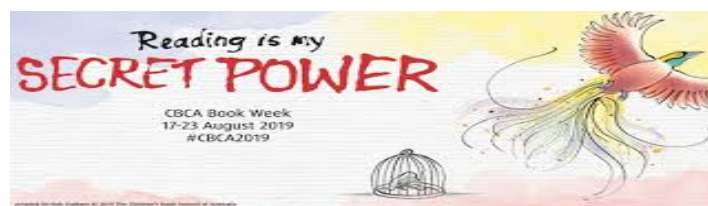

Last term, we learned about the four Zones, how our emotions flow between Zones and how our responses affect other people. We will follow on from this learning in Term 3 beginning with a lesson on how we can begin to look at patterns of emotions across the day and different activities and interactions that influence our Zones. This awareness enables us to have strategies “ready to go” that can help us regulate how we are feeling.

LESSON 3:

The Zones across the Day: What are my Triggers?

Students decide what Zone they would anticipate experiencing for a variety of scenarios. They explore the concept that all Zones are expected under different circumstances; and it is okay to experience all of them. Students reflect on how different experiences affect the Zone they are in. Students consider how internally they may be in a zone, but externally have to manage behaviours to match social demands of that environment. They consider the emotional diversity of others when making behavioural choices.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

- ✓ **Continue Zones check-ins before, after school and at other times of the week.**
- ✓ **Ask your child to share their patterns of emotions across the day. Are there activities that trigger movements in Zones? Are there people that affect our Zones more than others?**
- ✓ **Discuss intentional and positive responses to their patterns. Rather than opting out of activities that influence our Zones, help brainstorm ideas of how your child can prepare for these activities and learn to thrive in regulating how they respond and succeed.**
- ✓ **Connect with your child by sharing times when you have used different strategies to regulate your emotions. They don't all have to be “success” stories when you got it right, we can also learn by reflecting on times we got it wrong and what we learned from that time.**
- ✓ **Talk to your Classroom Teacher if your discussions have raised important thoughts.**

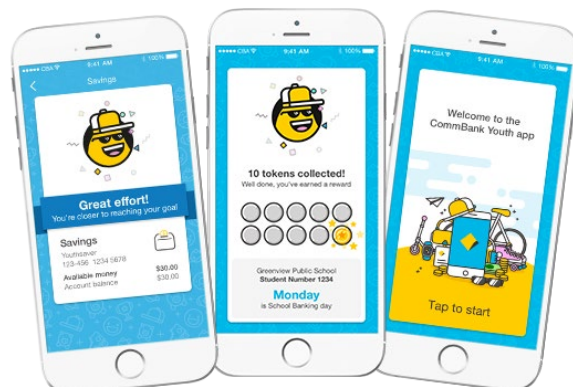
Enhance the School Banking experience with the CommBank Youth app

Student Enrolment K-6 FAQ

Does my local school have an enrolment policy?

Each school has an enrolment policy which provides information for parents intending to enrol their children. All policies are consistent with Department of Education Enrolment Policies and Procedures.

When can my child commence school?

Preparedness for school varies from child to child. You are encouraged to discuss any concerns with current childcare providers or make an appointment to meet with school staff. Students are able to commence from as young as 4 years of age, providing they turn 5 on or before the 31st July of the commencement year. Compulsory school attendance for all students commences at 6 years of age.

I reside within the local school catchment area. Will there be a place for my child at Bateau Bay Public School?

While you reside within the local catchment area, you are eligible to enrol your child at the school. Our office can provide confirmation that your address is within the school catchment area.

I do not reside within the BBPS local catchment area. Am I able to enrol my child?

Applications for non-local placement may be lodged and will be assessed by a panel comprising both school and community representatives consistent with school policy. Non-local places are limited by the number of vacancies made possible in permanent classroom facilities.

I currently have a child attending BBPS. I have since moved outside of the local school catchment zone. Is it possible for my other children to now be enrolled at BBPS?

Families who relocate outside of the local catchment area will be eligible to enrol future children at their **new** local school. Non-local applications for siblings can be made, and will be assessed consistent with school enrolment policy. *Parents wishing to ensure all children attend the same primary school have the option to enrol all their children at their new local school.*

My child does not currently have a placement or has been placed upon a waiting list for enrolment at Bateau Bay Public School. Are they able to participate in the school's Orientation Program?

Students with a confirmed placement at Bateau Bay Public School for the following year are eligible to participate in school's Orientation Program. Parents of all other children are encouraged to participate in any enrolment programs offered at their local designated school to assist with their transition to school.

When can I enrol my child?

Enrolments for the following year can be made from the beginning of the current calendar year. Families are encouraged to enrol early to enable the school to communicate relevant information to you throughout the year prior to enrolment. Early enrolment also assists the school to ascertain student numbers and plan staffing and resourcing. Successful enrolment made prior to the end of Term 3 of the preceding year will enable your child to be included in any Orientation Programs, usually held during Term 4.
