PRINCIPAL REPORT

KINDERGARTEN 2021

Attached to the front page of this newsletter is information regarding transition dates for our Kindergarten transition program 'Newbees' including the Information Evening to be held on Thursday 3 September at 6.30pm. ANTICIPATED ENROLMENTS 2021

To ensure effective and timely staffing of all schools the Department of Education requires anticipated enrolments for 2021. I therefore request any families who **will not** be at Bateau Bay Public School next year (this does not include Year 6 students who are moving to high school) to please contact the office by phone or emailing the school. This is critical to ensure we have a clear picture of enrolments and parents are kindly requested to make contact with the office if your circumstances change later in the year. As a school we can only plan based on the information we are provided by families.

STAFF DEVELOPMENT DAY TERM 3

On Monday 20 July staff will be involved in mandatory compliance training in CPR, as well as collaborative planning for teaching and learning in mathematics. Staff development days provide unique opportunities for staff to collaborate and improve curriculum, student wellbeing and support practices. Staff return on Monday 20 July followed by all students K-6 on **Tuesday 21 July**.

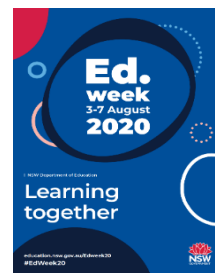
ATHLETICS AND CROSS COUNTRY CARNIVALS

Positive environments

It is important that our NSW public schools are positive environments and that parents and carers are kept informed of students' progress and school announcements.

Parents and carers can expect:

- To be welcomed into our schools to work in partnership to promote student learning.
- Communication from school staff will be timely, polite and informative.
- Professional relationships with school staff are based on transparency, honesty and mutual respect.
- To be treated fairly. Tolerance and understanding are promoted as we respect diversity.

Communicating with our schools

Our staff will find a time to talk to you when they can give you their full attention. Please remember that while our staff are in class or dealing with other matters, they may not be available to answer your questions immediately.

Our schools and communities will make sure that written communication is appropriate, fair and easy to read. We encourage you to use email and social media appropriately to connect with your school and stay up-to-date with up-coming events in the school community.

Respectful communication is a right

In all workplaces people have the right to feel respected. Unacceptable and offensive behaviour has no place in our school communities.

To ensure the wellbeing of students, staff and the community in our schools, steps will be taken to address unacceptable behaviour. This may include restricting contact with the school community or, in more serious cases, referral to NSW Police.

Unacceptable behaviour may include but is not limited to:

- Aggressive or intimidating actions, such as violence, threatening gestures or physical proximity.
- Aggressive or intimidating language, including the use of obscenities, making sexist, racist or derogatory comments or using a rude tone.
- Treating members of the school community differently due to aspects such as their religion or disability.
- Inappropriate and time wasting communication.
