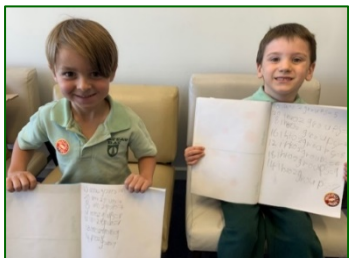

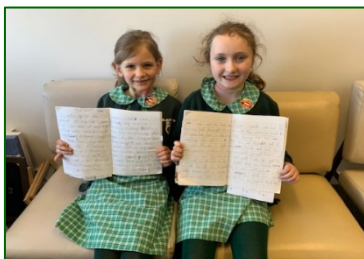

Parents are also asked to be mindful of the bottom carpark where students have been asked to walk along and access the school via the Marlowe Rd entry unless supervised by a parent.

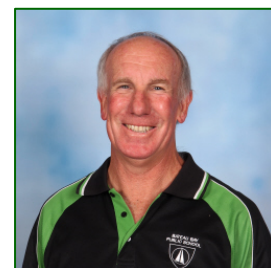
## KINDERGARTEN 2021

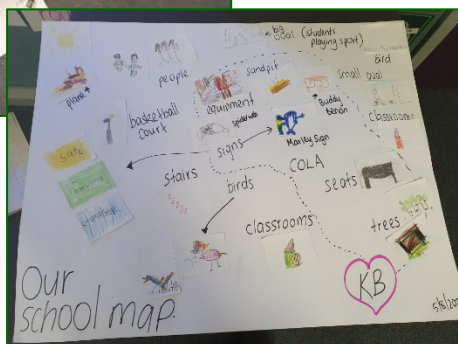

## CHECK-IN ASSESSMENT FOR YEAR 3 AND YEAR 5

This year, students in Year 3 and Year 5 will participate in a new reading and numeracy check-in assessment.

The Check-in assessment is a NSW Department of Education online reading and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor student progress following the period of learning from home.

The Check-in assessment will supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to meet student needs.

Year 5 will complete the assessment between 17 August and 4 September 2020.

Year 3 will complete the assessment between 21 September and 23 October 2020.

Students with a disability can receive the same level of support during the assessment that they would normally receive in the classroom.
